Located on the traditional lands of the Wadawurrung people, Narmbool was first settled by Europeans in 1839. The first building in the homestead precinct was a two-roomed bluestone cottage built around 1850. Today's homestead dates from 1889 and has been given a D-Classification by the National Trust. Today, Narmbool is a 2,000 hectare pastoral property and consists of the Garden Room Restaurant, as well as Narmbool Lodge, Manna's Outstations and Tea-Tree Bush Camp.

In this newly created full time position you will undertake a Certificate III in Landscape Construction whilst assisting with environmental conservation and maintenance of the property, and presentation of the heritage and other decorative gardens. A combination of onsite and offsite training will be required to complete the apprenticeship.

TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN THIS ROLE YOU MUST HAVE:

- Have a basic knowledge of garden terminology, however it is not essential
 - Possess a genuine interest in gardens and landscaping
- Be able and willing to undertake and complete an apprenticeship of 4 years
 - Have an awareness of OHS when using tools and machinery
 - Have good communication skills
- Have self-motivation and the ability to work with minimum guidance
