ORGANISATIONAL ENVIRONMENT

The Organisation

Sovereign Hill is Australia's foremost outdoor museum, and enjoys international recognition as such. Sovereign Hill Museums Association is a not-for profit community-based museum organisation that employees 350 people. The organisation includes Sovereign Hill Outdoor Museum, the Gold Museum, Sovereign Hill Hotel, Blood on the Southern Cross (BOSC) and Narmbool.

The Department/Area

The Mine Operations Department sits within the Commercial and Operations Directorate and is responsible for providing visitors to Sovereign Hill with an accurate representation of the gold mining era of the Ballarat Gold rush region. Delivery of historic information is undertaken in the form of working and static displays comprised within five variations of underground mine tour delivery; fully guided, self-guided, including audio visual and multi-language displays. Mine environment includes tickets sales, logging and office buildings on the surface and has 700 hundred meters of underground tunnels. The tunnels include two major visitor transporters; the inclined rail system and the quartz mine train.

Although a tourist mine rather than an operating mine, the department is heavily regulated due to safety and tourist mining legislation.
